Q 1. How can the Forum be involved in developing the Wellbeing Assessment?

- Given plenty of time to seek views of people they represent
- Ensure that data is provided at an early stage
- Be link between CCBC & communities
- Involve those who access the services – invite to the forum
- Simple response techniques e.g. multi choice tick boxes 1 – 10 scales etc.
- Consult and involve young people and consult essential services
- Plenty of communication opportunities
- Not just reps from organisations but members too
- Look at engaging with people in a variety of ways
- Support organisations to take part in the process
- Attend community groups
- Involve all organisations and their beneficiaries

Q2. How can we best engage with people, communities and third sector organisations?

- Invite members from 3rd sector groups to help shape the assessment
- Roadshows – ITV / BBC News Prize Draw !
- Via already established SLA's
- Feed info from the bottom up and not top down!
- Visit organisations
- Open Events
- Use projects to speak to the people they work with
- Talk to organisations who have direct contact with communities
- Listen – and feedback – Explain what is happening as a result of consultation
