The Caerphilly Public Services Board, made up of the key decision makers across the public sector in the Caerphilly county borough, are leading an assessment of local well-being. The aim of this assessment is to help guide their decision making and create the *Caerphilly We Want* for now and future generations. This work is required under the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, which calls on Public Services to think more long-term in planning together and to work with local people and communities to build a Wales that we all want to live in, now and in the future.

Turning now to improving **health** and **social care** provision in the Caerphilly county borough - Caerphilly County Borough Council and the Aneurin Bevan University Health Board are currently undertaking an assessment looking at peoples' needs for health and social care services for now and the next five years.

In general terms it can be said that **a health need** is one related to the treatment, control or prevention of a disease, illness, injury or disability, and the care or aftercare of a person with these needs. While **a social care need** is one that is focused on providing assistance with activities of daily living, maintaining



independence, social interaction, enabling the individual to play a fuller part in society, protecting them in vulnerable situations and/or helping them to manage complex relationships.

With this in mind, we would be grateful if you could answer the following questions to help us improve the provision of health and social care services in the Caerphilly county borough:
